The unseasonably cold dry spring weather made for a slow start to the growing season, but everything is now certainly catching up. This is the busiest time of year for our gardeners, who have been planting out the summer bedding in our gardens. The design for this year's 'logo bed' at Greenhill Gardens is 'Thank you to the NHS'. It is created from 15,000 carpet bedding plants, which have been expertly grown from seed and cuttings by our nurseryman in the WTC greenhouse. Along with the plants (and weeds!), the grass is now growing at a rapid pace and our grass cutting teams are working hard keeping our open spaces in good condition. We are looking forward to welcoming back both visitors and residents to our award-winning parks and gardens during this summer season.
