TEMPORARY TRAFFIC MANAGEMENT ORDER OF CHICKERELL ROAD, WEYMOUTH

DORSET COUNCIL has issued a Notice under Section 14 [2] of the Road Traffic Regulations Act 1984 as amended. The Notice is needed in order to comply with health and safety regulations which require the provision of safe working areas and to minimise the likelihood of danger to highway users.

It will come into operation on 8 May 2025 between 09:30 and 15:00 and remain in force for five days, but it is anticipated that the works will be completed by 8 May 2025.

This Notice will enable Roadtechs Group on behalf of Dorset Council to carry out essential highway maintenance works.

The effect of this Notice will be:

- [1] To impose temporary road closure on Chickerell Road between its junctions with Baycliffe Road and the Admiral Hardy pub, a distance of approximately 415 metres
- [2] To impose temporary clearway on Chickerell Road between its junctions with Baycliffe Road and the Admiral Hardy pub, a distance of approximately 415 metres to prevent vehicles from stopping except those associated with the works.

Please note that any vehicle waiting in contravention of temporary parking restrictions may be removed under the provisions of the Removal and Disposal of Vehicles Regulations 1986. If a vehicle has been removed, the owner must contact the Council's vehicle recovery contractor: Ashleywood Recovery Ltd/Bride Valley Recovery Ltd on 01305 889421.

A locally signed diversion route will be put in place to enable traffic to travel around the closed section.
